Sunnyvale gets a climbing gym

Planet Granite opened its Sunnyvale branch at a grand opening held over June 3 and 4. The gym replaces Planet Granite's Santa Clara facility, which is now closed.

According to Planet Granite the gym boasts:

- 120 top anchors, up to 60 feet high
- Bouldering, and more bouldering!
- Weights and Fitness
- Spinning too!
- Best cracks this side of Yosemite!
- Yoga Studio
- Outdoor climbing and bouldering

Planet Granite Sunnyvale claims it is the tallest and largest gym in California. In e-mail sent to

members, the company says that the highest part of the building is 60 feet high.

"Santa Clara by comparison was 30 feet tall. Mission Cliffs in San Francisco is 51 feet high. We built approximately 20,000 square feet of ropedclimbing walls with 120 top anchors," the e-mail reads. "We have a wicked overhanging 70 degree lead-only head lead wall that is seriously steep with routes starting at 5.10c all the way up to 5.13c."

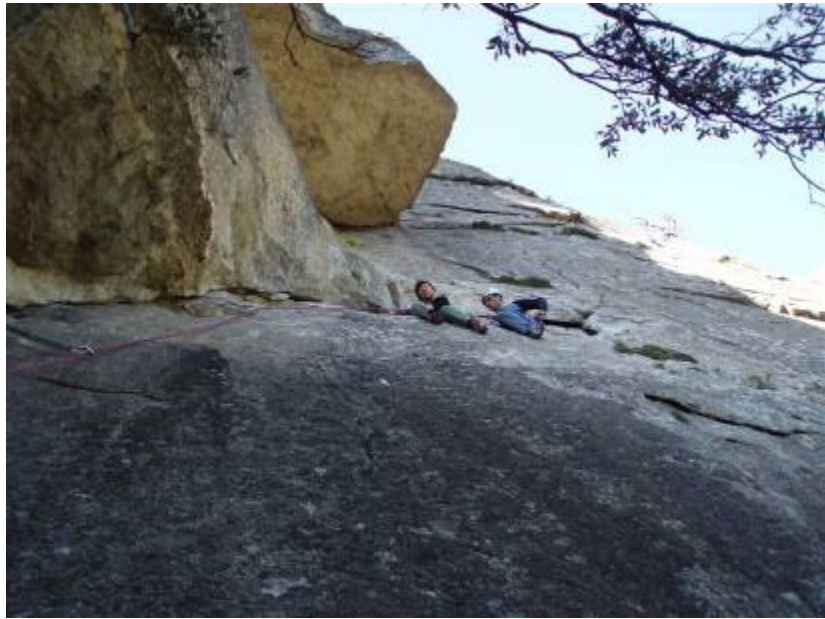

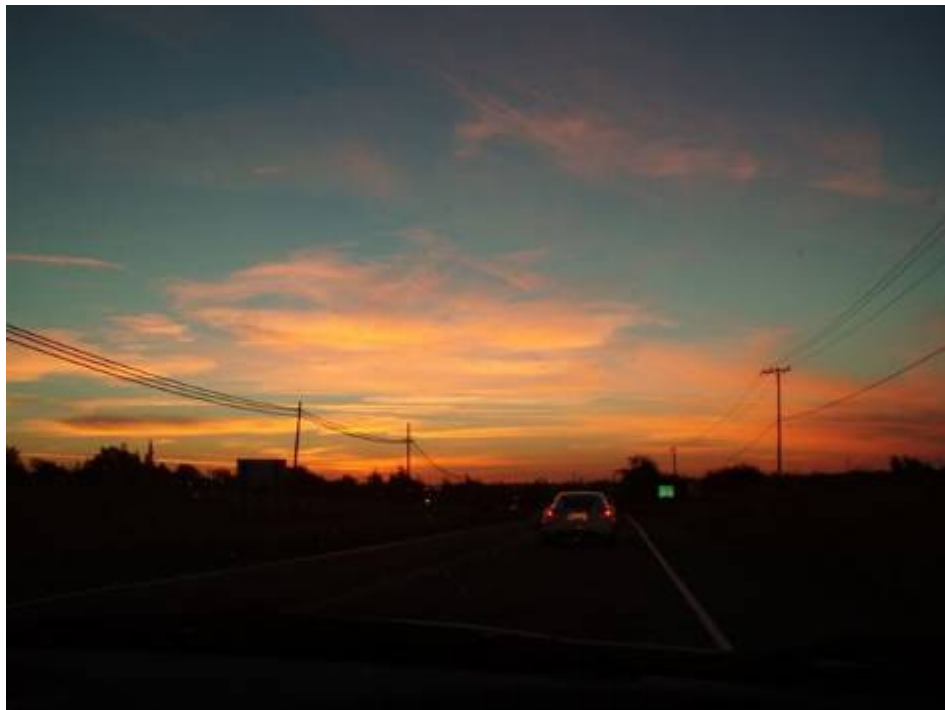
